There was no Parish Council Meeting in January 2019. There will be a full report following the February Parish Council Meeting on Tuesday 5th February 2019.

Public Meeting Friday 28.12.18

Over 112 people attended the Public Meeting on 28.12.18 to discuss the following planning applications.

**PLANNING REFERENCE: PL/0121/18
MINERAL SITE: PROPOSED SKILLINGTON QUARRY, LAND TO THE EAST AND WEST OF CRABTREE ROAD, COLSTERWORTH

MINERAL SITE: PROPOSED SKILLINGTON QUARRY, LAND TO THE EAST AND WEST OF SKILLINGTON ROAD, COLSTERWORTH
GRID REFERENCE: 490285 32903**

The Colsterworth and District Council share the concerns of Parishioners and have formally raised their objections to this plan as set out below.

SUMMARY OF KEY OBJECTIONS TO THE APPLICATION

1. The fundamental objection is that there is no established need to quarry limestone in either quantity or of the quality from this application and this is in direct contravention of the Authority's own Mineral and Waste Plan (2016) and Lincolnshire Aggregate Assessment 2018.
2. There has been insufficient time for consultation (despite our request) to consider properly all the information and data which is contradictory and confusing and extremely technical.
3. This is a controversial development and this matter should be referred to the Planning and Regulation Committee for further consideration/consultation/process and not through "delegated" powers.
4. We believe that the leases/permissions expired several years ago, and the ROMP should be rescinded.
5. We do not believe that the application identifies without doubt who holds the current and legitimate government licence for extraction from the areas in question and we must assume that this has been clarified by LCC with the applicant.
6. We would expect that all areas referenced in DA1, DA9 and DA11 (not the subject of the "Study Area" identified to be worked at Stainby) are permanently deleted and all historical permissions are declared void under a legally binding variation document
7. We have been advised by the current Contractor that the life of the limestone extraction is six years (not 25-30 years as suggested) and therefore, a legally binding variation document should ensure that there will be no further working on all the referenced areas in the permissions after that date other than for reinstatement of the land within an agreed timeframe. The Traffic Assessment (3.1.) has stated that the peak traffic movement will be 2026 therefore, this variation must be imposed, or this contradiction clarified
8. In respect of reinstatement of the land; there must be no new landfill site in the area which

again has been identified in the Authority's own Plan as not being required. This would also include taking inert waste from other contractors within or without the County.

9. There is apparently, a plan currently in place for the existing contractor that stipulates that there is no traffic movement on the B676 through Stainby and Colsterworth and that all lorries use the A1 corridor (North and South bound) to ensure access to the site in and out of Crabtree Road, without crossing the A1. This is not what the Traffic Assessment states, so this condition needs to be imposed.

10. The Traffic Assessment submitted also states that there will be traffic to and from Melton Mowbray passing through Stainby. The information from the current contractor states that there will be no traffic along this route; again, this condition needs to be formally imposed.

11. The application does not therefore, sufficiently provide a satisfactory traffic management plan and the assessments did not take account of all the roads affected (A1, B676) and current cumulative effects of current excessive HGV and quarry traffic on the B676, speeding and other associated noise, air and dirt pollution and degrading of the roads in the Parish.

12. A clear Traffic Management Plan must be imposed and adopted by any contractor using the site with systems put in place for consistent and independent monitoring and enforcement.

13. We must emphasise that if this application is successful despite all the objections, access must come from the A1 at Crabtree Road both North and South with trucks using the bridges at Colsterworth and Little Ponton with no use of the B676 at Colsterworth or Stainby for all quarry traffic (that applies to current, new or other contractors picking)

14. Any work being carried out should be restricted to five days a week (Monday to Friday) to preserve the rural nature of the Parish which offers amenities to residents and visitors through nature trails, walking and cycling.

15. Footpath 1, Stainby, runs inside the Southern boundary of the proposed site. This was determined by an Inspector at a Public Inquiry held in 2016 and is therefore legally binding and indisputable. This footpath is a valuable and well-used amenity for the residents of the parishes.

16. There is no benefit identified for the community in terms of employment.

17. A Section 106 agreement should be imposed as a minimum. The content of the S106 agreement should be agreed through the consultation period of the planning application with the relevant parties and planning officer and most specifically include the Parish Council. This should include paying for substantial improvements to the Crabtree Road/A1 junction.



NATURAL HISTORY BULLETIN

With the proposals to quarry in the vicinity of the Lincolnshire Wildlife Trust's Roadside Nature Reserve at Woolsthorpe it may be of interest to know why this site is important. It is over 40 years since Mrs Lee Cave, then a caretaker at Woolsthorpe Manor, reported dozens of bee orchids on the north facing side of the verge and the site was subsequently taken into the care of the Trust in an agreement with the County Council. Since then the site has been regularly recorded and managed for the scarce limestone plants and the insects which depend on them. 185 different species of flowering plant have been recorded.



They include those restricted to unimproved limestone grassland - Quaking Grass, Greater Knapweed, Wild Parsnip, Wild Basil, Lady's Bedstraw, Fairy Flax, Marjoram, Salad Burnet, Bee Orchid and Pyramidal Orchid. 23 Butterflies include

scarce and declining Skippers. A visit by an expert in 1999 found 43 different kinds of beetles. Every year it seems there is something new to discover. It is the natural progression and evolution of the site which is of interest. It is important that it remains poor in nutrients so that aggressive plants don't take over. Every year it is mown and the mowings removed. Walking along this verge in January one could be forgiven for wondering where the interest is. January is well described as the 'dead of winter' though this year in some areas it has been livened up by both late flowers from the autumn and early ones from the new year. Aconites and Snowdrops were out by the end of December. Amongst the birds only the robin singing. Frosts ensure that only the bracket fungi and a few specialist gill fungi are found.



The conical tufted brittle stem with its long white stems was finding some heat from an old manure heap. The dark brown stemmed, golden capped velvet shank emerged from a rotting log. Both are illustrated.



There are almost no flying insects mid-winter so it was a surprise when a Peacock butterfly emerged on a sunny mild day from a log pile and found some winter honeysuckle in a garden to feed on.

To look for in February: Well that's easy this month! Hazel catkins and alder catkins shedding pollen, and then the tiny red female flowers. The first of the flowers selected under a National Recording Scheme which looks at climate change is the lesser Celandine and this was in flower mid-January along Water Lane. The next to look for is the Coltsfoot. The first tree whose leaf emergence is recorded is the Elder. Then there is the start of bird song and in most years a warm day brings out bumble bees. Of course if it snows then we shall be confined to looking for footprints. I look forward to all your records at 61 Woolsthorpe Road, 860465, e-mail jnostler@hotmail.co.uk Jane Ostler

It was fantastic to have 112 concerned residents attend the meeting held on 28th December to hear from our Parish Chairman, District / County Councillor and a representative from a mining company working locally. Both the Parish Chairman and Councillor Adams assured us they would be fighting the applications as robustly as possible.

Questions raised ranged from dust, environmental pollution, noise and transport issues, whether the permissions had been checked regularly and what the due process with LCC was, as it appears unclear whether the whole area mapped out on the applications is to be worked.

Since the meeting, group members have been busy planning our way forward and liaising with the parish council. We understand the process may take some time for the applications to come before the full planning committee at LCC and they may even be revised again to take into account errors/omissions.

We have also had advice from a planning consultant who specializes in this area, but there is a cost to this of £600.00. A Just Giving page has been set up to fund this, so if you can donate, please do. Every little helps!
