The Clerk has invited Village Hall Committee, the Social Club Committee to meet with the Parish Council who are Custodian Trustees of the Village Hall to ensure the continuation of the lease. Date to be confirmed.

Allotments

Dogs on allotments

A request was made to allow dogs on the allotments. After discussion Council members concluded by a majority that there should not be a change to the Tenancy Agreement rules. The council has 46 allotments in total at Woolsthorpe and Colsterworth and recognises that some tenants are dog owners but there are also many that are not.

Highways and Footpaths Working Group

1. A meeting with Lincolnshire County Council Officer Rowan Smith has been requested. District Cllr Adams has been on annual leave and will be away from duties in October. The Clerk will follow this up at then end of October for an update on the formal request previously made.
2. Community Speed Watch – The application has been acted on swiftly and five passive 30mph speed notices will be displayed within the Parishes.
3. The Clerk has contacted local land owners to cut back the hedgerows.
4. Thanks to much work done by the Chairmen John Walden the Vehicle Activated Sign (VAS) is ready for installation at Stainby. Unfortunately, there is no lamp post in place to site the sign. Currently awaiting advice from LRSP regarding installing a post to

site the VAS on.

NATURAL HISTORY BULLETIN

Exceptionally warm days in the second week of October (to 24C) were followed by the high winds and rainfall of storm Callum. On Sunday 14th October it rained all day before a drop of 10C on Monday 15th, so that it was surprising to see wasps on the Michaelmas daisies in the late afternoon after the rain had just stopped. The next morning one was found tangled in the remains of a garden spider's web which it had destroyed in its struggles to escape. Even more surprising was a Humming Bird Hawk Moth briefly visiting a hanging basket of petunias on 17th October. A Common Green Shield bug, which turns brown as winter approaches was seen on shrubs. There are plenty of plants flowering late, in addition to seasonal ones like the ivy, which are buzzing with insects when the sun comes out. As well as hoverflies and the honey bee there are carder bees. The workers of these, with their ginger thoraxes often continue well into the autumn, after which only the queens survive. On narrow strips of grass verges Musk Mallow, Fleabane and Yarrow were in flower. Rough grassland and woodland rides were dominated by members of the thistle/daisy family, and in the special limestone verges there were still field scabious and knapweeds.

Abundance of seeds and fruits in the wild means that small birds are not tempted into our gardens but some are beginning to return. Long-tailed tits are in parties and collecting thistledown to line their collective winter nests. Blue, great and coal tits, blackbirds and thrushes are back in good plumage. Great spotted woodpeckers have been constant in their visits to one garden which makes special provision for them. Many larger birds are now seen in groups. Gulls fly north west to Rutland water at dusk. Rooks, accompanied by some jackdaws return to roost in ash trees. Starlings often have to seek another winter roost when they are evicted from ones in gardens. The crow though sticks to its solitary routine.



Good to have reports of 3 Little Egret seen alongside the River Witham. The release of game birds from their rearing pens is evidenced by the numbers of these unworldly youngsters found as road

casualties. In a neighbouring parish, 30 French partridge were seen on a lane, circling round like lost sheep, slow to fly off when approached. Unlike the red kite, the buzzard was not introduced into this area, but spread in from elsewhere. Its success as a breeding bird here has been much helped by the availability of reared birds.

The fungi season has been slow to start but Shaggy Ink Cap (or Lawyer's Wig) and the Common Ink Cap have been seen in gardens. Both are described as edible when young but the latter can make you very sick if taken with alcohol! Rings of Clouded Agaric mushrooms can be seen around trees which they are helping support by providing them with excess nitrates. There have been plenty of reports of plant galls. A whole range are found on oaks - particularly young ones. Some need both common and Turkey oaks for two separate stages in their lives. On oaks, those seen which have common names are spangle galls, cherry galls, knopper galls, oak apples and marble galls. On maple nail galls. On thistles a flask shaped gall, on walnut blister galls. More about their intriguing life styles next month. To Look for in November Daylight hours are getting shorter. FIREWORKS

BE AWARE - BE SAFE

Take care on this Bonfire Night by following a few simple precautions
ALWAYS supervise children around fireworks and bonfires and keep pets indoors.
HAVE one person who is responsible for the fireworks or bonfire and make sure everyone is clear who that person is.
KEEP a bucket of water, sand or hose nearby in case of emergencies. **BUT** don't tackle a fire yourself - call 999 and get to a safe place.
KEEP fireworks in a closed box.
LIGHT fireworks at arms length with a taper and stand well back.
NEVER go back to a firework that has been lit - even if it doesn't go off it could still explode. **NEVER** throw a firework.
NEVER give sparklers to under-5s
DON'T hold a baby or child while using a sparkler.
LIGHT sparklers one at a time and wear gloves.
NEVER leave a bonfire unattended.
KEEP everyone well back from open fires.
NEVER use petrol or paraffin on a bonfire.
NEVER put used fireworks, aerosols, foam filled furniture, batteries, tins of paint or tyres on a bonfire.
ALWAYS pour water on the embers before leaving the bonfire at the end of the party.
