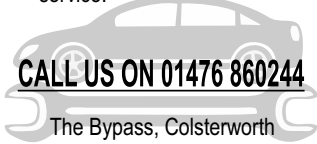

Parish Council meeting held Tuesday 3rd April 2018

In the approved absence of the Parish Clerk, Cllr Hainsworth provided administrative support to the meeting.

Clerk's Report and items arising from the Minutes.

1. The Councillor Vacancy North Witham & Lobthorpe has been advertised as a Casual Vacancy for the required fourteen-day period and the Clerk has contacted SKDC who have confirmed that no election has been called. The vacancy has now been advertised as co-option with a closing date of 20th April 2018.

2. The dangerous disabled ramp at the new COOP building has been altered and made safe to use.

3. The standing water at the public footpath adjacent to the new COOP car park has been reported to LCC Highways and action has been taken to improve the drainage. The Clerk will monitor this.

Update provided by Cllr D. Cox: Recent heavy rain has exacerbated the standing water on the road north side of the Co-op; there are also difficulties on the opposite side of the road where the council carried out work; the verge and pavement are now submerged.

4. The Clerk has reported the fallen B676 sign post on the A1 exit/entrance of the Bourne Road roundabout to Lincs County Council Highways & Highways England. Both agencies deny responsibility. The Clerk has again contacted Lincs CC Highways.

5. An update has been received from SKDC regarding the Woolsthorpe Conservation Area Review advising that once SKDC have made a site visit they will inform the Parish Council of any amendments.

6. The Defibrillator pads were replaced on 9th March 2018 at the Woolsthorpe Road, Little Legs Nursery, North Witham & White Lion Defibrillator sites due to their expiry date of 17th March 2018.

7. The Clerk has sent out the Annual Allotment Renewal Invoices for April 2018 – March 2019.

8. The Neighbourhood Watch team have requested that the Junior Eye's Booklets handed out in the December 17 meeting be handed back to them at the April meeting.

9. The new COOP due to open on Thursday 22nd March was delayed due to IT problems.

a) 07/03/18 – Notification received by LLC of **Temporary Footpath Closure**
Reason for closure: Essential maintenance works by Sustainable Energy Ltd

Location: Link footway between Back Lane & Beech Close

Period of Closure: 09/04/18 – 13/04/18 (Closure to be implemented as & when required during this period, signage detailing accurate dates & times will be displayed on site in advance)

b) 08/03/18 – Email received advising that the gate to the entrance of Old

Post Lane Cemetery is difficult to open, there are mole hills making the Cemetery look unsightly and queried why there was no tap to obtain water from. The Clerk arranged for the village handyman to repair the gate and a local mole catcher has visited the area and caught several moles. The mole hills have been flattened and the Clerk will monitor the area to see if any further mole hills appear.

c) 12/03/18 – A resident contacted the Clerk to ask if there were any garages for rent on the High Street. The Clerk passed on the link to SKDC website for Application for a garage.

d) 06/03/18 – The Ingle Charity annual statement was received, and the Clerk replied with a letter acknowledging receipt of the statement.

e) 16/03/18 – Notification received from Leicestershire CC advising that the carriageway resurfacing on the B676 will now be planned for after Easter due to severe weather being forecast. Once scheduled further notification will be sent.

f) 15/03/18 – Email received from Buckminster Parish Clerk advising that there was likely to be a potential increase in traffic through Stainby and Colsterworth at the weekends with members of the British Model Flying Association (B.M.F.A.) travelling from the A1 to the previous Equestrian Centre between Sewstern and Wymondham which now belongs to the B.M.F.A.

g) 19/03/18 – Email received advising of a large amount of bottle, cans etc on the stream side of the play area adjacent to the Village Hall. The village cleaners have collected the litter and will monitor this. Also a request for gravel to be spread on the public footpath along the river Witham north & east of where it meets the footpath from Old Post Lane. This public footpath is the responsibility of Lincolnshire County Council and the Clerk has reported this request to them.

theWI INSPIRING WOMEN

There we were, waiting at the door lah lah lah lah and like the song no one came to let us in until he got a reminder that it was the third Tuesday of the month. Oh dear, did he get some stick when he arrived. He, being Melvyn, had had a senior moment. He said that it wasn't his fault, it wasn't in the diary he said. Never mind, it was a quick set up and we were only a couple of minutes late starting when our new President, Sandra Quinsee welcomed members and a couple of guests from Corby Glen W.I. She told us who our committee officers were and their assistants (oh deep joy) and who was doing the other jobs needed to run an efficient team.

Sandra introduced our guest speaker, Dawn Oska, one of the three fund raisers for the charity, The Mobile Chemotherapy Unit, although the organisation is soon to change its name to Mobile Cancer Care Unit. The charity started in the South of the country and over the years has steadily been moving northwards county by county. Lincolnshire is the furthest north so far. Since 2007 when they had just one vehicle by 2016 they had sixteen. They stand outside of hospitals, hook up to the electrics and are able to treat twenty patients, four at a time in the unit. Grantham is the point in this area where they treat the cancer patients. They also visit Skegness, saving patients having to travel to Lincoln. Nurses are provided by the NHS but otherwise all running costs are borne by the charity as they receive no government aid. Maintenance cost allowance is £260,000 over three years, so they rely on people to donate, just like the Air Ambulance has to. It saves people having to travel long distances, they have only been in Lincolnshire for the last four years, what a

help it must be for our local patients not having to travel on that awful ring road into Nottingham's City Hospital. If any of our readers are interested, they are organising a "Wing walking" event. If it is on your bucket list I'm sure that they will be interested (her eyes light up when "my friends" volunteered me) shame that it's in Gloucestershire, too far to travel she said. Pity that she can't find a nearer venue, isn't it? Liz Clark thanked her for a most interesting talk and said that they did a very valuable service.

Refreshments were enjoyed courtesy of hostesses, Helen Scorrer, Kathleen Biggs and Joan Baron (the parkin was lovely girls and the coffee and walnut). Back to business and we were told that a tree guard was needed for our Rowan tree which we planted. Already a branch has been damaged. We are to seek a more attractive price (the quote was four or five times more than we paid for the tree) for one that we have received. But, if anyone has one which they no longer need, now that the tree which you planted all those years ago has grown, we would be very grateful to receive it at a reasonable price. Please have a look in the back of your garage, workshop or wherever you keep those things which you might find a use for one day and we could give it a good home. Thank you.

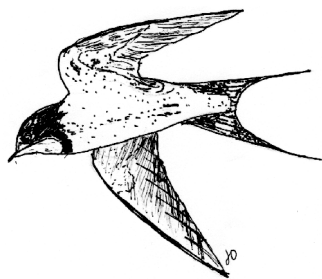

NATURAL HISTORY BULLETIN

After weeks of wintry weather, temperatures climbed rapidly on 18th April, followed by record breaking highs on 19th. Wild plants, at least a fortnight late flowering, developed rapidly. The flower bees, first males and then females, joined seven species of queen bumble bees and honey bees in the garden. The volcanoes of the tawny mining bees nests were spotted in gaps in the paving. Their parasite, the broad-bordered bee fly, hovered nearby. Small Tortoiseshell, Peacock, Comma Brimstone and Large White Butterflies were out. The first Holly Blue was seen. No Red Admirals have been reported. Their food stores may have not lasted the longer winter.

Frog and toad spawn developed into tadpoles and food for adult newts. A large grass snake was seen on the Nature Trail and a lizard sunning on a wall scuttled away before it could be photographed. Two fat hedgehogs have been recorded at night on a camcorder, tucking into food left for them in a purpose built hedgehog house.

The first swallows were seen on 4th April, earlier than usual, but by 20th none had been seen back in their nesting sites. In one new garden, careful note has been made not only of a long list of birds visiting but also of their food



preferences e.g. Sparrows and Finches, nuts and sunflower seeds; Starlings and Jackdaws, fat balls; Collared Doves and Wood Pigeons, scraps on the floor. A Sparrowhawk, alas, preferred the birds themselves. Amongst many observations of birds nesting were Blue Tits in a gap in a wall, Blackbirds in a dovecote and Robin in an overturned pot. A recent survey of birds by the Game and Wildlife Trust listed the 25 most commonly seen species. Five of these are on a Red List of Conservation Concern. We are fortunate that farmland in our parishes includes headlands managed for nature conservation. Some declining birds don't venture into our gardens. Spring is the best time to visit ancient woodland sites. Twyford Wood and Morkery Wood are on our doorstep. In spite of past felling and replanting with conifers, much of interest survives. These are Forestry Commission owned/managed and

free to visit. Tortoiseshell Wood is a Lincolnshire Wildlife Trust Nature Reserve and a Site of Special Scientific Interest and as such the wildlife needs to be treated with care.

To Look For In May Wood Anemone may be over but Wild Garlic will be in flower, the scarce herb Paris, Wild Sorrel and Twayblade Orchid. Wet grasslands have Cuckoo Flower, the food plant of Orange Tip butterflies, hedgerows the Cuckoo Pint (or Wild Arum) and yes, we hope to hear the first Cuckoo, along with more summer migrants, the last of which is the Swift. The scarce Dingy and Grizzled Skipper Butterflies emerge this month. Kingcups are out in wet places and where the Primroses and Cowslips flower together there may be their hybrid the False Oxslip. Some curious fungi appear in May if the weather is right. I look forward to your records and observations at **61 Woolthorpe Road, 860465**, e-mail jnostler@hotmail.co.uk.

They are cheap to buy and designed for the job. Please do NOT improvise using empty bread packaging or similar light weight bags – they split, and you can imagine the result! Some councils have stricter rules on dog fouling. They may make owners carry a poop scoop and disposable bag when they take their dogs out to a public place.
